#### **Informatives**

#### **Hazardous Chemicals**

If required, the applicant should seek any necessary approval for the storage of hazardous chemicals at the location indicated on the proposed site layout. The storage of these chemicals may need to follow guidance from DEFRA, the Environment Agency,

Please note that to prevent land contamination and pollution of any regulated water courses or groundwater, storage of hazardous chemicals would normally require a bund around any IBC chemical storage to contain 110 per cent of the maximum capacity of the largest tank or drum. It would also be prudent to have any outside store covered to prevent rainwater filling the bund or rain causing an overflow during or after a catastrophic failure of any drum/tank.

### **Gas Storage**

The compound to store the compressed natural gas cylinders shall meet current statutory requirements, relevant Standards and Codes of Practice, including (but not limited to) those for Health and safety:

Additionally, you may be required to discuss and notify both the gas storage and the spirit manufacture with Northumberland Fire & Rescue Service so they have a record of such an installation should they ever have to attend this location. Such a commercial installation may require a risk assessment from the Fire & Rescue Service. It is recommended that you contact the Petroleum Licensing officer at Northumberland Fire & Rescue Service through our contact centre on 0845 600 6400.

## Food and Legal Controls

Should the application be granted it is strongly recommended that the applicant contact the Commercial Team in the Public Protection service, via the Information Centre 0845 600 6400, at an early stage to ensure compliance with food safety / health & safety legislation.

It is also recommended that the applicant urgently speak to Ken Henderson in the Commercial Team regarding composition, labelling, weights & measures etc. He can be contacted on or by e-mail on
