### 2. Recommendation

I see no grounds for objection to the proposals as presented.

### 3. Reason for Recommendation

The proposal is situated within a former whinstone quarry, closed in 1976 and subsequently landscaped. It is highly unlikely, therefore, that significant archaeological remains have survived within the boundary of the former quarry site. As a result, there can be little potential for actual harm to archaeological deposits caused by the proposals. With regard to the setting of the World Heritage Site, the scale of the proposals is in my view unlikely to cause harm.
