	I would have liked to have seen reference to the farmhouse's structural development in the application. Whitelee (HER 14961) was described by Grundy as "a house with a complex building history". This includes 18 th century origin with additions and alterations in the 19 th . This would have shown how the proposal fits with the overall historical development of the building.	
	Reason for Recommendation The nature, scale and location of the proposal is unlikely to cause harm to archaeological remains and the proposal will constitute an improvement to the existing building layout. As such, there are no reasonable objections to the proposal.
