# **Assessment of proposal:**

It is considered that the proposed development conforms in highway terms with the National Planning Policy Framework.

The proposed access to the car port will need to be constructed in accordance with NCC Type A specifications. All demolition works will require a brief construction method statement as the property is located along a 60mph road despite its rural location.

It is advised that sufficient space is retained within the site to allow for the safe turning and manoeuvring of vehicles to enable them to enter the highway in a forward gear.

The construction of the car port/garage is providing one additional car parking space, and is considered an improvement on the current arrangement.

Refuse is stored internally and collected/disposed of privately.

Therefore, we have no objections subject to conditions.
