Assessment of proposal:

• The proposed development has been assessed in conjunction with the National Planning Policy Framework. The proposed visibility splays identified at the pre-application stage are required to conform with Manual for Streets standards.

Assessment of Proposal Checklist

- Transport Statement or Assessment Not required.
- **Pedestrian routes, Public Transport and Cycles** Access by sustainable modes are in keeping with the rural nature of the surrounding area.
- **Road Safety** The proposed access required visibility splays of 2.4m x 90m due to the 60mph speed limit. The access can achieve these splays and this can be seen on the proposed plans document.
- Travel Plan Not required.

- **Car Parking** 2 car parking spaces have been shown on the site layout plan. This conforms with NCC Parking Standards. An internal parking area has also been shown and is considered acceptable.
- **Cycle Parking** Cycle parking has been shown on proposed plans and is considered acceptable.
- **Highway Works** The proposed access will be constructed in accordance with NCC Type B specification. It should be noted that Northumberland County Council can carry out minor access works as proposed.

- **Refuse Storage and Servicing -** Refuse storage has been shown on the proposed plans. The owner of the let will utilise NCC Commercial Waste Scheme to clear the refuse which is acceptable.

Implementation of car parking area
