I have read the bat risk assessment that accompanies this application and no have objections on ecological grounds. I note that to give an net gain for biodiversity that the report suggests the erection of swegler bat boxes. This is a welcome addition, but is it something that you can condition? I also note that some leylandii trees are to be removed. In the heritage statement rhododendron is mentioned as a replacement; I do not think this would be something to encourage and native hardwoods may be more appropriate depending on how close to the churchyard wall they are to be planted. Perhaps a landscaping condition could be put on if permission is granted. If you wish to discuss this further I am happy to do so.
