In order to facilitate timber extraction off a steep ground site in Whiteburn Forest a 500m track is required across younger clearfell on flatter ground. This will provide access for Skyline to safely winch material uphill for processing and extraction to roadside.

Track will be 500m in length and 4m wide, excavation will be to hard base with topsoil being put to one side for reinstatement post operations. Brush from the processing of trees can be used to protect track during operations.

Post operations track will be put back to natural form and managed as open habitat.
