Dear Colin,

Thank you for consulting me on this application. I have studied the supporting documents and have a couple of comments/observations. The applicant has taken heritage assets into account in designing the scheme and it is likely the only location which reduces negative visual effects upon heritage assets whilst remaining practical. I would have liked a paragraph on the development of the farmstead/hamlet from the 14<sup>th</sup> century Peel, 18<sup>th</sup> century farmstead and early 20<sup>th</sup> century estate. The photographs in the heritage statement need to show how the buildings fit within the landscape context, taken from slightly further out.

However, the form of the settlement is linear in plan and the new shed would fit with this plan. I am also pleased to note the alignment of the proposed new shed back of the existing hay shed and in line with field/woodland boundaries.

Any approval should take into account the permanence of the woodland effectively screening the shed.
