#### Assessment of proposal:

When assessing this application, the Highway Authority checks that the proposal will not result in an adverse impact on the safety of all users of the highway, the highway network or highway assets.

The information submitted has been checked against the context outlined above, it is considered that this development will not have a severe impact on highway safety, and there are no objections in principle to the proposals.

The proposed development is located at Fell End Farm at Greenhead in Brampton.

The proposal is for a new vehicular access to provide better access and visibility to serve existing farm associated with the Fell End farm. It is noted from the heritage statement that 'the current access location is on a hill and the vision splay to the East is not considered to be sufficient'.

The new vehicular access will be onto the B6318 which is subject to 60mph speed limit. A plan FE/09/PAP/07 has been submitted showing the visibility splays of 2.4 x 215m at the proposed access point which are in accordance with 'Design Manual for Roads and Bridges (DMRB) which is considered acceptable. There are some trees and hedges which fall within the required visibility splay area, and these will need to be removed to keep the visibility splay clear from obstruction.

The new vehicular access will be constructed to NCC's access specifications, which is acceptable, it should be noted that the first 6m of the access will need to hard surfaced, a condition is recommended to secure this.

It is noted that the existing access is to remain in place as it is on the route of a public right of way, Bridle Way 518/021, and the Planning Authority may wish to consult the public rights of way team, to ascertain what works, if any, are required to this vehicular access or if it is required to remain in it current layout.

Subject to conditions and informatives recommended below HDM have no objection to the proposal.
