### **Consultation/Representations**

**Historic England** – Further clarification was sought by Historic England on indicative cabling detailed within the application. This was clarified by the agent as not being a part of the application, that it is being dealt with by the agent of the landowner as a separate issue.

Historic England also confirmed that because the application required the crossing over of a major scheduled accident monument, a method statement was recommended.

It was mentioned in further correspondence from Historic England that one of the proposed poles was located on the edge of the Roman Vallum. The client has confirmed that the pole would be within the Vallum and they intend to apply to Historic England for scheduled monument consent.

Historic England is satisfied that the additional information addressed their concerns and so do not have issue with the application.

**Historic Environment Officer** – No objections on the basis that the poles are on a like for like basis. Care should be taken to avoid recorded archaeological remains during the replacement works and it is recommended that the contractor is made aware of the archaeological sensitivity of the area.

#### <u>Assessment</u>

#### **Policy Context**

Part 15 Class B of the 2015 GPDO states that:

Development by statutory undertakers for the generation, transmission, distribution or supply of electricity for the purposes of their undertaking consisting of—

- (a) the installation or replacement in, on, over or under land of an electric line and the construction of shafts and tunnels and the installation or replacement of feeder or service pillars or transforming or switching stations or chambers reasonably necessary in connection with an electric line;
- (f) any other development carried out in, on, over or under the operational land of the undertaking constitutes permitted development, unless section 37(1) of the Electricity Act 1989 applies.

The Overhead Lines (Exemption)(England and Wales) Regulations 2009 state that Section 37(1) of the Electricity Act shall not apply in relation to development listed in the exemption regulations; as such, the proposal is considered to be permitted development and the



# Local Planning Authority can only object to the proposal on grounds of environmental impact.

The Local Planning Authority has been consulted under the Electricity Act 1989 and the Overhead lines (Exemption) (England and Wales) Regulations 2009 for the removal and replacement of 3 electricity poles at Lowtown, Greenhead.

Lowtown, a Grade II listed Building is located within the open countryside approximately 2.5km north east of the village of Greenhead, approximately 120m south from the nearby unclassified public road. The site occupies an isolated position within the landscape atop the Vallum Scheduled Ancient Monument, within the setting of Hadrian's Wall. The proposed electricity poles would serve Lowtown, replacing the 3 current poles in their current location. The building has stood derelict for a long period of time and suffering from decay. An application to convert the building to holiday accommodation was approved in 2017. The existing electricity poles that serve the property are to be replaced to improve the reliability of the electricity supply in the local area and to bring the current electrical network in line with Health and Safety Regulations.

It is understood from consultation with Historic England that one of the poles would fall on the boundary of the Vallum Scheduled Monument and that the scheme would require the crossing over of the Scheduled Monument. Historic England in their consultation response highlighted the requirement for a method statement for the works, as well as an application for Scheduled Monument Consent. An informative, notifying the applicant of these details has been attached to this report.

As part of their initial consultation response, Historic England requested further information relating to the associated cabling for the scheme. The consulting Officer was satisfied that the details submitted by the applicant addressed their concerns. No objections were received from historic England.

The Park's Historic Environment Officer raised no objections to the application on the basis that the poles are on a like for like basis.

The consulting Officer also requested that the care should be taken to avoid recorded archaeological remains during the replacement works and recommended that the contractor be made aware of the archaeological sensitivity of the area. An informative, notifying the applicant of these details has been attached to this report.



# **Recommendation & Conditions**

It is recommended that the following representation is made:

Northumberland National Park Authority raises **no objection** to this notification and **does not** wish the Secretary of State to consider the application.
